
programme will cover the units Keeping Myself Safe and Rights and responsibilities.





# **Spring Term 2025**

We will be looking at the work of Edward Tingatinga a Tanzanian based artist who inspired the Tingatinga art movement. Our art work will also be closely linked to


our Design and Technology topic this term.

# History



We will explore and understand the significance of the sinking of the Titanic, developing the concept of global travel by boat before affordable air travel and understand the time this took. the risks and the impact on

people's lives. We will know how and why this "unsinkable" ship sank through eyewitness accounts and a range of sources.



This term our learning will be centred on the questions What do Christians believe God is like? & What is the good news Christians believe Jesus brings?

This will include looking at the importance of Easter for Christians. Children will make sense of beliefs and to understand the impact these beliefs have on our everyday lives and those of others. We will encourage the children to question, reflect and to evaluate.
