This week at the Wyche

It's been lovely to have you back this first term of 2022! The weather has been (mainly) bright, clear and frosty and our assembly theme this half term is "What gives us hope?". Lateral Flow Changes

The government has announced further temporary changes to testing requirements:

LFD: If you get a positive test on a Lateral Flow Device (rapid-result home test kit) from Tuesday 11th January you must self-isolate immediately. You no longer need a confirmatory PCR test but must report the result to NHS Test and Trace.

PCR: If you develop any of the three main symptoms (cough, temperature and/or change in smell or taste) you must self-isolate and seek a PCR test (at a central testing site), as previously.

Any positive case may begin Lateral flow testing on the 6th day of self-isolation and providing there is no temperature may come out of isolation after **two** negative lateral flow tests in succession **taken 24 hrs apart.**

We encourage parents to LFD regularly to help control the spread of Covid.
