We will understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of some of the Commonwealth countries.

We will explore the Strive values that we have developed and adopted as a school.

RE
This term our learning will focus on Islam and we will be looking at the following question-**Who is a Muslim and how do they live?** We will recognise the words of the Shahadah and that it is very important for Muslims and identify some of the key Muslim beliefs about God found in the Shahadah and the 99 names of Allah. Our teaching will enable the children to make sense of beliefs and to understand the impact these beliefs have on everyday lives and those of others .We will encourage the children to question, to reflect and to evaluate.

Music
Mrs Harrison will continue to teach the children to play the recorder and will also teach the class to use their voice through songs.



History
We will study the lives of significant individuals from both the past and the present - Queen Elizabeth II and Queen Victoria. This will include sensitively looking at how the Commonwealth was established and how it has changed.
