Covid and Parents' Evening

We continue in "Living with Covid" times, but as you are well aware there are still cases of COVID in society and in school. We would ask you to be particularly sensitive about symptoms. Firstly, if your child has any COVID symptoms, please keep them at home and seek a PCR test to confirm, returning after two negative lateral flow tests, 24 hrs apart. Secondly, if you yourself have symptoms or have had a PCR and are awaiting results, please don't come onto site to potentially spread it to children and adults, some of whom may be vulnerable.

Next week we're having a face-to-face parents evening and may I appeal to you, if you have any symptoms: a cough or temperature, change in taste or if you feel particularly unwell, to stay at home and we can reschedule for you. We will ventilate classrooms and you're welcome to wear a face covering if you wish. We will keep a reasonable distance to protect members of staff who will, of course, then have multiple interactions with other adults. It's great to have these face-to-face opportunities again, but they come with common sense risk assessments to keep us all safe and hopefully we'll be out of this situation soon.

Online safety

In recent safeguarding update training, I was informed that in 90% of recent cases where children were abused or exploited there was an online element, and of these, 90% involved a child who had access to an unsupervised device in their bedroom. It's worth reflecting that there are steps that we can take in our home to keep children safe. "Where you are going", "who are those people you're

talking to?" and "how long are you going to be?" are sensible questions whether we are playing outside or online.

Ukraine

The Friends and ourselves will be raising money for disaster relief in Ukraine next week. We think it is very important to allow children to feel they have the power to do something so we will make a map of Ukraine in the hall and give the children the chance to place a monetary donation onto the map, as if they are giving it directly to Ukraine. <u>Coronavirus</u> The Department for Education have asked us to share the following information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 year olds with you:

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the

> Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the

> > UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book.

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions. Further information is available in the

guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years published byUKHSA. We have published some frequently asked questions on thevaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibilityadvice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19.Following advice from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children willalsobe offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.The NHS willprepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all childrenduring April.
