Free School Meals

The rules around Free School Meals have changed as the Government is now broadening its offer of Free School Meals for September. If you are in receipt of Universal Credits your child is now likely to be eligible to receive Free School Meals, even if they have not done so before. You will need to submit an application on the Worcestershire County Council website (copy and paste the link below). Please keep in touch with the school office so we can ensure that you are getting your entitlement or if you need any help with the process.
