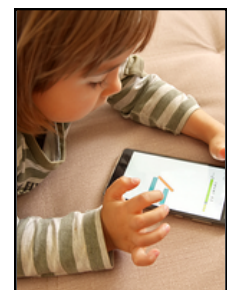
Collective Worship

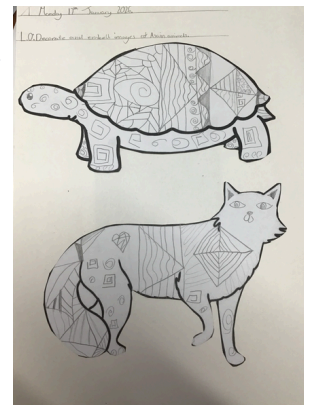
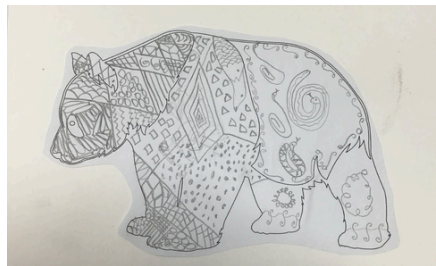
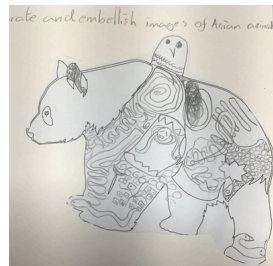
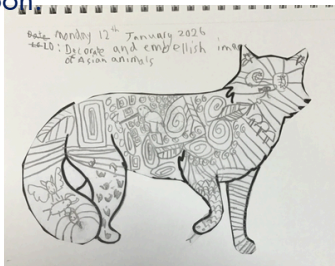
World Book Day
