Magnetic forces

We will revise our understanding of forces, including the big one: Gravity. Then we will focus our attention on another invisible force: Magnetism.

We will consider what forces are involved when we take part in sport, before thinking about what objects are attracted to

magnets and why. Next we will explore how magnets behave towards each other and translate this learning into

designing our own game using magnetism.




